




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
EXPONENTIAL GROWTH CURVE

Preliminary Examinations

Examination Rules

- Arrive at school to register at <u>8.40am and 1pm</u> for the exams. You must attend lineup at 8:30 so that your tutor can register and escort you up to your exams.
 (take into account the traffic)
- If you are running late, please phone the school
- Students will line up outside of S Block first
- No mobile phones, watches of any kind, iPods, earphones (inc. Airpods) and MP3s or calculators unless permitted (these should all be in your bag which will be locked away)
- You should not have notes on your possession (please check your blazer pockets)
- You must bring black pen NO GEL PENS
- Only clear pencil cases are allowed on your desk
- There is absolutely **no talking or communication** between students
- Full uniform must be worn for the exam. Your blazer must be worn to enter the hall and kept on the back of your chair if taken off.
- No food is allowed in all examination rooms
- Water bottles are allowed in the exam hall if necessary. These should be clear bottles with a spill-proof cap, water only in the bottles. There should be no label or print on the bottle.

- 2. Create a realistic schedule.
- 3. Plan ahead by working backwards
- 4. Revise using your preferred learning style.
- 5. Take breaks and chunk working time (no more than 40 minutes)

DON'T

Just keep going! The body and the mind need regular 'time-outs'. Use breaks effectively, particularly after completing a task.

- Use websites e.g bitesize or mymaths



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
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- Students were given a revision pack during Term 6 of year 10
