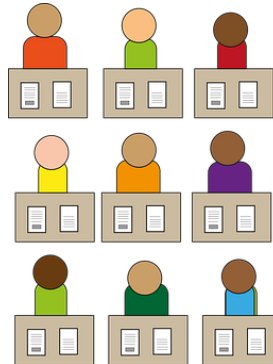

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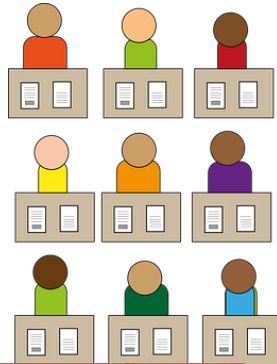


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Unit 1H – Russia 1855-1964 (part 2).

- Tony Blair and New Labour – Political, Social and Economic impact, Iraq war, International relations.



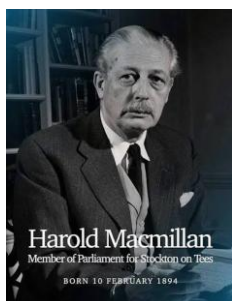

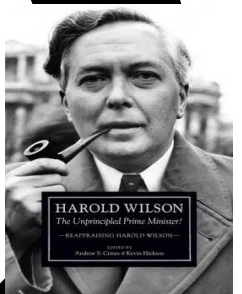


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Unit 2S: The making of Modern Britain 1951-2007 (part 1).

- Background – WW2 and Attlee's Labour government.
- The Conservative 1951-64– Churchill, Eden, McMillan, Hume, Suez crisis, Profumo affair, decolonization of the Empire. Immigration and Enoch Powell.
- Labour 1964-1970's – Wilson and Callaghan's governments, clashed with the trade unions, problems in Northern Ireland, social and cultural changes
- The rise of Thatcher and the problems of the 1970's – strikes, youth culture, football hooliganism.
- Assessment focus – mix of essay and source questions each term.
