

Term 2 is well underway here at Holcombe.

Year 11s are reviewing their prelim examinations that they sat before half term and Year 13 are finalising their preparations for their prelims which will start in just over a week from now. However our focus is never solely on our examination year groups; next week our Year 7s will have 'thinking' lessons during their P1 lessons each day where we will teach them specifically how they can use a range of thinking tools to support their learning. As you all know, we are proud to be a Thinking School and we were delighted to hear recently that The University of Exeter has now accredited us as an Advanced Thinking School. Here is a quote from the conclusion of their report:

The substantive evidence provided by HGS creates a very clear picture of a Thinking School in which Thinking Skills are at the heart of school life. Thinking Skills are fully embedded in the culture of the school such that HGS is a collaborative educational community. The dissemination of best practice across the school and beyond positions HGS as a beacon of metacognitive excellence where best practice is nurtured so that children develop as holistic lifelong learners. The focus on the professional growth of staff is exceptional. In conclusion, the application has provided compelling and comprehensive evidence for accreditation, and I therefore recommend that accreditation as an Advanced Thinking School be awarded until September 2025. Congratulations to Holcombe Grammar School for an exceptional achievement!

This achievement has resulted from years of hard work by our amazing staff – congratulations to all concerned.

Whilst examination results and thinking skills are important, far more importantly today is Remembrance Day and as a school we have been pausing to consider this. Assemblies this week have been held by Mr Wrigley (Head of History) and have encouraged students to consider the impact of all recent conflicts on our local community, as well as remembering that we should honour the deaths of all those who sacrificed their life for our country, from all over the world. It has been great today to see some of our students in their cadets and other military uniforms and as a school we observed the 2 minutes of silence at 11:00 in honour of our fallen heroes.

KS3 Student Workshops

Over Term 2 and Term 3, we will be leading a series of workshops for KS3 students. There will be 6 sessions in total, the first of which was held on Monday 7th November. Our SEN team, in conjunction with our Educational Psychologist, will work with a small group of students to help develop a range of skills and strategies based around developing resilience, confidence and transition skills.

Following our first workshop, we were delighted to welcome a group of parents and carers to school. This provided an opportunity to outline the structure of the workshops but also to highlight the work of our SEN Department ('The Haven') and staff in supporting their children. We were able to discuss strategies used in school and share some strategies which could also be used at home. We were then able to host a short Q+A session and introduce key members of the SEN Team who support students throughout the school day in The Haven.

The students were complimented by our Educational Psychologist, for their engagement and efforts throughout the workshop and it was a pleasure to be able to share stories of their endeavours and successes with their families. For many of the parents present, it was their first opportunity to engage directly with the school and we remain grateful to those who found the time to join us to support the students.

Here's what some of our team have to say about being a Thinking Ambassador:

"Thinking is a way of understanding about the way people learn and how you can learn better. Last year, we did a Thinking Week to help different year groups with their learning through the variety of thinking tools that we use here at Holcombe. We did sessions on habits, growth mindsets, hats, maps and even the science of learning. These topics are especially useful for progression."

"I became a Thinking Ambassador last year, and I am in Year 9 at HGS. I assisted in last year's Year 8 Thinking Day, where I supported in lessons using my own knowledge of the techniques. In the near future, we will be hosting a Year 7 Thinking Week event, which will increase their understanding of the various thinking skills which we use at Holcombe. The open morning for Year 6s included a stand displaying some past examples of our techniques and information about those for students and parents to look at and talk about."

"I can say personally that being a part of the Thinking Ambassadors student drive team has increased my own understanding and ability to use thinking tools in my own life and schoolwork, and I am sure this applies the same to my peers. This year we are revamping the system and icons for the thinking tools; you may have already noticed the change in thinking hats to resemble fedoras even more."

Class Charts Reminder

Many thanks to all parents who are able to let us know in detail why students are late or absent from school, please continue to do so by 8am on each day of absence. We have made some changes to our absence reporting. We now expect all lateness and absence to be reported through our classcharts software, this is to enable swift and accurate processing of this information, as well as removing the need for you to confirm voice messages with written evidence. Through classcharts, written reasons can be sent directly to our attendance office, and medical evidence can be attached directly where appropriate.

If you access your child's profile on classcharts, you will see the Absences. Selecting this tab will display a list of absences that you have reported, once you have reported them. This includes when the absence took place, the reason for the absence and who acknowledged your absence report.

To report an absence, click on the Report new absence button. Next, enter the details of the reported absence into the form provided. You can also include up to 5 files in your absence report as supporting evidence. To do this, click on the Attach supporting evidence button and select the files of your choice. Click on the Submit button to send your pupil's absence report to their school. The absence can be edited and deleted until it has been acknowledged by a member of school staff.

This can also be used to report lateness too.



Personal Development

For their Personal Development lesson this week, Year 9 were treated to a Financial Wellness Power Session from Gospel Eadweardfilia, from myfinancialfixer.com. Her 10 years' experience in helping young people and their parents has helped them eliminate debt so they can save, invest and change their financial wellness, and Year 9 students were given an overview of the strategies needed to put this into place.

Gospel's presentation was supported by David Agbogo, the director of <u>Double Two financial Planning</u> and Partner within St. James's Place, Wealth Management. He has worked in the financial services for the 15 years and shared some of his own knowledge and understanding with the students.

Our Personal Development curriculum this term is focusing on Life Skills across all year groups in order to help our students move a step from "living an unhealthy and financially disorganised life" to "healthier and wealthier lifestyle".
