

Dear parents and carers,

By and large the examinations have gone well up to this point and the vast majority of students are seeing their hard work paying off as they leave the examination hall with a degree of confidence that they have been able to demonstrate their knowledge in that particular subject. South East Regional Swimming Championship

The boys competed in Winchester over two weekends in April and May against some really tough competition and both went home with medals.

- 100m backstroke reached the final finishing 5th
- 200m backstroke reached the final finishing 6th
- He also competed in 200m individual medley, 50m & 100m Freestyle and 50m butterfly where he moved further up the rankings.

Competitors across all three Key stages competed against each other with the first leg holding an astonishing 20 games after school. Those that could not attend were offered a reschedule and were sat at lunchtime on Tuesday.
